Jointly organised by the ERS and the Europe LAM Federation, this session will give professionals a comprehensive overview of the multiple presentations of LAM and complications, both pulmonary and systemic. The session will aid clinicians to deliver optimal clinical management of this rare and complex disease. The session will be aimed at clinicians of all grades, physiologists and nurse specialists.
